President's Column

The theme of last year's 4th of July Parade was "Red, White, & Blue Goes Green." With apologies to the parade committee I have always thought of it as "Bird Rock Goes Green" and it has been in the back of my mind since. It represents what many of us are thinking and doing in our homes but also what we are doing as a community.

The traffic calming measures currently under construction were designed for safety but there is another aspect to them—how they will affect our community's environment. The trading of stop signs for yield signs means no more idling engines or rapid deceleration/acceleration of vehicles that pump out dirty exhaust and brake dust, especially when compared to cruising down the boulevard at an efficient 15 to 25 miles per hour. That makes our air cleaner to breathe and there will be a lot less traffic noise. But there is another extraordinary effect; that is, the greening of Bird Rock.

It started years ago when the original developers and philanthropic residents provided for three parks in Bird Rock—Bird Rock Elementary Park, Calumet Park, and Rock Park. And that vision continued in the '80s and '90s when volunteers led by the late Bruce Minter and others planted street trees in the merchant district

And now we are experiencing the single largest "green" change to Bird Rock. As we watch the asphalt ripped from our streets, it is being replaced with plants. Lots and lots of plants. To be precise, over 64,000 square feet of asphalt is being replaced with groundcover, shrubs and trees. That is an area equivalent to 12 residential lots! Or nearly equal to the combined area of our existing three parks!

While the advantages of plants over asphalt seem obvious, it bears repeating. Of course, there is the aesthetics of plants where there was formerly the faded black of old and cracked asphalt. Those plants will scrub our air and make it cleaner and fresher. Perhaps Bird Rock will be a tiny fraction cooler as the landscaping absorbs the summer sun instead of the asphalt reflecting the heat. And when it rains the drops will be captured by the landscaping. Instead of the rainfall washing the dust and oils and grease off the city streets and carrying that urban pollution to our beaches that rainfall will help water those plants. While a drop in the ocean's bucket, that landscape will capture and reuse nearly 400,000 gallons a year of rainwater instead of that stormwater polluting our beaches and ocean.

What else are we doing? Starting with this issue the Bird Rock Newsletter will be printed on recycled paper as was the recent mailer announcing the M.A.D. annual meeting. It is a small step, but one in the right direction.

Past newsletters have urged us to "Shop Local" to help our merchants and enhance our sense of community. But shopping local is also a very green thing to do. It reduces the length of our car trips; even better, it allows us to walk or bike for dining, shopping, and personal services. And with Albertson's nearby and Longs soon to open, we can walk to buy our staples and groceries.

We will be exploring other ideas to keep Bird Rock going green and welcome your ideas. How about another park? How about stormwater diversion to improve the water quality off PB Point? Think Bird Rock. Think green.

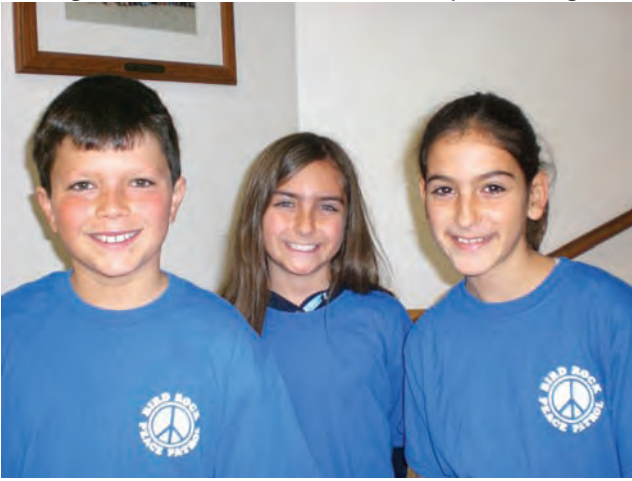

A Long Discussed Dream that Will Come True This Year

Looking Northerly from Bird Rock Park to Waverly Avenue at Proposed New Gate and Ramp

For the past several years our community has been working with the City Department of Park and Recreation, Bird Rock Elementary School, and the School District to provide a new gate that would allow Bird Rock residents to access the public park behind the elementary school. As it is now, after school hours, you have to go around to the south side and access it off Van Nuys Avenue or the Van Nuys Alley—not very convenient for what is supposed to be a park for Bird Rock! Also the current entrances to the park are not compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA.) So this new access point would be ADA compliant as well, another big plus.

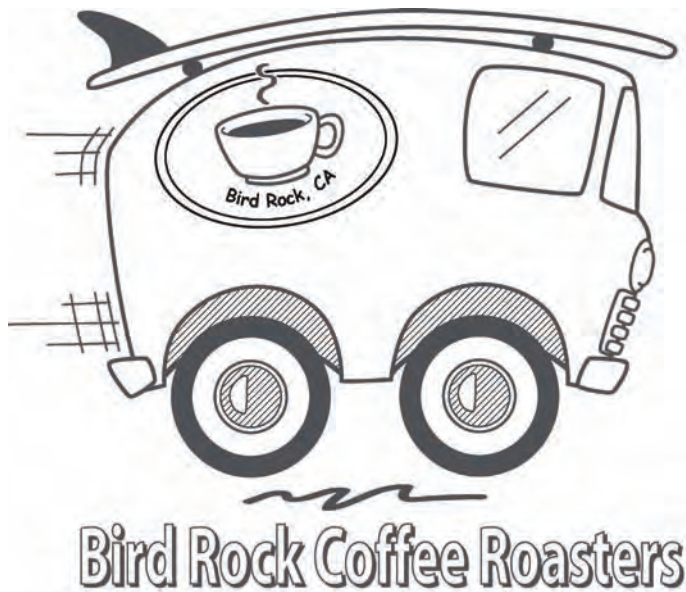
For those with good memories, you may recall that Bird Rock architect David Neagley graciously donated his time to prepare construction drawings for the new gate and concrete ramp. The design has met the approval of the School and the School District.

We had an approved design and a "community friendly" bid from a local contractor. But, where to find the money? The 2006 Bird Rock Tour of Homes was the first major fundraiser for the project. In 2007 Council District 1 and Council District 2 promised us additional funds. But we were still short.

The good news for 2008? First, through the hard work of Co-Chairs Michelle Fulks and Julie Cockrell, we held another major fundraiser in January, the Bird Rock Tour of Homes. Second, City Park & Rec is getting into the picture. The City will add important elements to the project: a concrete sidewalk that will connect the new gate to the existing Colima sidewalk along the Waverly Avenue right-of-way (currently just a dirt and gravel street) plus other ADA-compliant improvements within the park itself.

We will be discussing these proposed improvements at our community meeting on Tuesday, February 5 at the Masonic Lodge. Please be sure to attend if you have any questions or concerns, or if you can offer us further assistance.





Since 2002 Bird Rock Coffee Roasters has been known as San Diego's source for organic and Fair Trade coffee. While we remain committed to Fair Trade coffees, we continue to push beyond that certification as we find additional avenues to give back to the farming communities that grow the exquisite coffees we roast every day.

To coincide with our new Rwandan coffee that arrived in January 08, Bird Rock Coffee Roasters has purchased three bikes for the Bikes to Rwanda program, an organization that ships heavy-duty bikes to Rwanda which farmers use to transport coffee cherries from their farms to the processing stations that were used to process the green beans that we roast.

We will also be featuring more Cup of Excellence Coffees in 2008. The Cup of Excellence is a competition that rates the top 20-40 coffees from each major growing region. The coffees that are selected for the competition are auctioned off to the highest bidders and the farmers who grow these special coffees get 3 to 10 times more for their crop than they would through the commodities market or via Fair Trade and the money goes directly to the farmer. These are very special coffees that we will only have for a short time. In February, we will be featuring three Cup of Excellence Coffees from the 2007 competitions—supplies will not last long since we will be one of only a handful of Californian roasters offering the following:

Guatemala 2nd Place

For Roberto Sanchez Lazo, quality controls are important at his farm. A very clean, and elegant coffee, unlike any Guatemalan coffee you have tasted.

Colombia 3rd Place

Diogenes Perdomo has been growing coffee in Colombia for 40 years. Diogenes does not cut or burn the natural shade trees that cover his farm, nor does he use any chemical pesticides. Only 4/100th of a point away from 1st place, this is a sweet and lively coffee with a creamy finish.

Nicaragua 1st time Qualifier

Domingo Montoya qualified for the 2007 competition in his first attempt. Not certified organic, but his coffee is responsibly grown, and Domingo garnered about four times more for this crop at auction than he would have via Fair Trade. Clean, nutty, and complex.

Bird Rock Maintenance Assessment District

Annual Meeting

Tuesday, February 5, 2008, 6:00 pm
Masonic Lodge (5655 La Jolla Boulevard)

The annual meeting of the Bird Rock Maintenance Assessment District (MAD) is hereby called for review and approval of the proposed annual budget for Fiscal Year 2009 (July 2008 to June 2009.) Upon community approval, the budget will be submitted to the City of San Diego for inclusion in the City's annual budget process which starts in late February and concludes with the mayor's and city council's approval.

In 2004 the community voted to form the MAD and appoint the Bird Rock Community Council as local managers. 2007-2008 is another transition year as the MAD awaits the turnover of the public landscaping from the private developer and the city's contractors. In the meantime, the MAD continues with its obligations under the maintenance agreement with the City including maintenance of the Boulevard street trees; monitor and arrange for graffiti removal along the boulevard; and, the timely replacement of burnt out street lights. The MAD also monitors the public landscaping between Colima and Midway for traffic and pedestrian safety as well as working with the City to assure that the landscape and irrigation are in good condition before they are turned over to the MAD. Through a competitive bid process the MAD selected a landscape maintenance contractor but has not yet put them under contract since we do not have an actual start date for the work. The 2006-2007 BRCC and MAD books were audited as required by the City and our books were given a clean bill of health. We expect to hire a manager on an hourly as-needed basis in Spring 2008; the manager will take over the work that has been done previously on a volunteer basis.

The landscape maintenance portion of the MAD should finally roll out in 2008. Specifically based on information from the City and the current progress of the traffic calming improvements, we project that the MAD will take over the "SeaHaus" portion as well as the neighborhood landscaping sometime in Spring 2008 and the remainder of the boulevard landscaping by Winter 2008.

On the other side of this flyer is the proposed budget for 2008-2009. The budget is based on our projections of when the MAD will take over each element of the public landscaping. Again, for 2008-2009, we are budgeting for 12 months of maintenance of the "SeaHaus" portion and the neighborhood landscaping and for 6 months of maintenance for the remainder of La Jolla Boulevard. The budget also provides for satisfying other obligations as required under the contract with the City of San Diego.

Revenue has exceeded expenses for the past two years and is expected again for 2007-2008 year. Excess funds accumulate in an interest-bearing account reserved and protected for the Bird Rock MAD; by state law it can not be touched. We propose, as we have for the past three years, to not touch this reserve until we go through one year of full operation.

With the delay in the installation of the public landscaping the MAD can continue to operate at a lower revenue rate while sustaining its healthy reserve. The 2008-2009 assessment rate is proposed at **\$79.00** per equivalent benefit unit; that is \$79 per single-family home. For 2009-2010, the assessment will likely climb closer to the allowed rate as all of the public landscaping will be in place and the MAD will be at full operation.

The annual meeting is an opportunity to critique the previous year's performance and review the draft budget for the next year. We welcome your participation and comments.

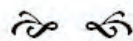

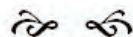
